

USE OF INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE IN INCREASING EFFICIENCY OF EDUCATION QUALITY

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Annotation

On this issue, President Shavkat Mirziyoyev Miromonovich launched a movement to study the educational experience of leading countries and reform the education system. 2. There are private and public schools in this country and there is a strong focus on teaching English in private schools. Because these types of schools are so valuable to the general population, most children attend public schools.
3. The dense population of China in itself creates a strong competition between them. That is why children spend more than 10 hours a day in school. Then they go home and do their homework again until ten in the evening. In the big city, there are some extra classes with the tutor on the weekends, and the children participate in music, art and sports clubs. If children do not pass the primary school exam well, they will be required to enter the university.
4. There is also a special school for low-achieving, lazy students who do not want to study, and parents place such children in kungfu schools. This type of school is characterized by strict disciplinary measures and strict discipline. Children who graduate from school will have three qualities: the ability to work, respect for adults, and adherence to strict discipline.[2]

With these unique aspects, China has become one of the leading countries. The third country worth exploring the education system is Singapore. After Britain left the colonial regime, the country gave strength to reform its education system and today it has achieved great heights. At the same time, 95 percent of schools are connected to the Internet The uniqueness of the Singapore education system is that the teacher is chosen according to the student's wishes (or on the advice of the parents).
